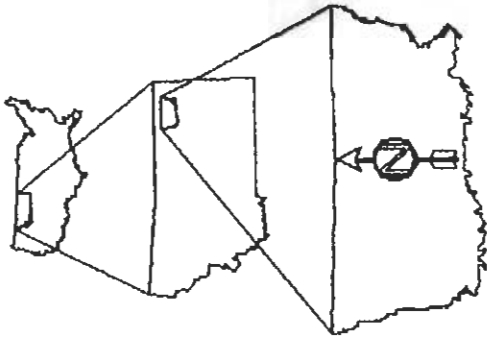
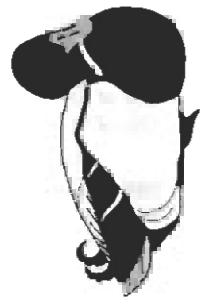
Welcome to the Fort Peck Reservation based in Poplar, Montana and home of the Assiniboine and Sioux Tribes.

Our natural resources have always been important to the existence of the tribes. Please observe the rules and regulations as outlined to insure this continued enjoyment of the vast resources by all.

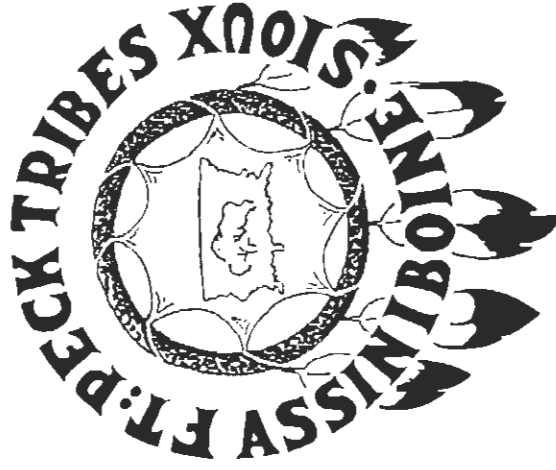

General Fishing Regulations

All Non-Fort Peck Tribal Members fishing within the boundaries of the reservation must possess a tribal fishing license. Fishing is open year round from February 28 to March 1, to include open water and ice fishing.

1. No person(s) shall lay, set, or use any drug, poison, medicated bait, explosives, or other lurch or injurious substance for the purpose of catching, taking, killing, or destroying any fish.
2. No person(s) shall lay, set, or use gill net or any hoop nets for the purpose of catching, taking, killing, or destroying any fish.
3. No person(s) shall knowingly aid or assist in the concealment of any fish that have been unlawfully taken or possessed.
4. No person(s) shall set minnows or similar bait traps unless these traps are marked and labeled with your tribal conservation license number.
5. A maximum of 6 set lines and 6 hooks per line is allowed for fishing open waters. A maximum of 6 lines is allowed for fishing through ice. No person may possess more than one day's limit of fish while on the water or actively engaged in fishing. Jugs and set lines have to be labeled with your Tribal Conservation License Number visible within 10 yards of where they are set. Jugs will be limited to 30 hooks.



Paddlefish

1. A paddlefish stamp must be purchased along with the Tribal General fishing stamp.

2. Limit of one (1) per year.

3. Limit Season: May 15 to June 15.

4. Catch and release is permitted.

5. Tag must be attached to the paddlefish between the back and the dorsal fin.

6. Each paddlefish angler must cast for and hook his or her own paddlefish. Any tag which has been altered or modified shall be void.

General Rules and Hunting Regulations

1. All non-Fort Peck Tribal members hunting within the boundaries of the reservation must possess a valid Conservation License and appropriate Stamp.
2. No person shall pursue, shoot, kill, take, or attempt to take any wildlife between one-half (1/2) hour after sunset of one (1) day and one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise of the next day.
3. Trespass - You may not hunt or fish on private, fee, deeded, or allotted land within the boundaries of the reservation without permission from the land owner.
4. No shooting within 500 yards of any occupied building without the consent of the person occupying such building.
5. Leave gates closed for livestock purposes.
6. Littering - Pack in, Pack out, don't litter the area you are hunting or fishing.
7. Every person while hunting or accompanying someone hunting shall wear an outer garment containing a quantity of daylight fluorescent orange sufficient to be easily detectable by other hunters.
8. No hunting of varmints or fur bearing animals.

Checkpoints

All sportsman are required to stop as directed by the Tribal Conservation Officer of the Fort Peck Tribes on their way back from hunting area's, even if they possess no birds when checked.

Upland Game Birds

1. Game birds being transported must have one leg or head, or sufficient plumage attached to allow identification of the species.
2. Road hunting prohibited - Small game, pheasants, and waterfowl cannot be taken on or from a road or right-of-way of an improved road or highway within the boundaries of Fort Peck Indian Reservation.
3. No person may refuse inspection and counts of wildlife. Any motor vehicle, camper, and trailer may be stopped for such inspection and count.
4. No shooting of hawks, owls, or eagles.

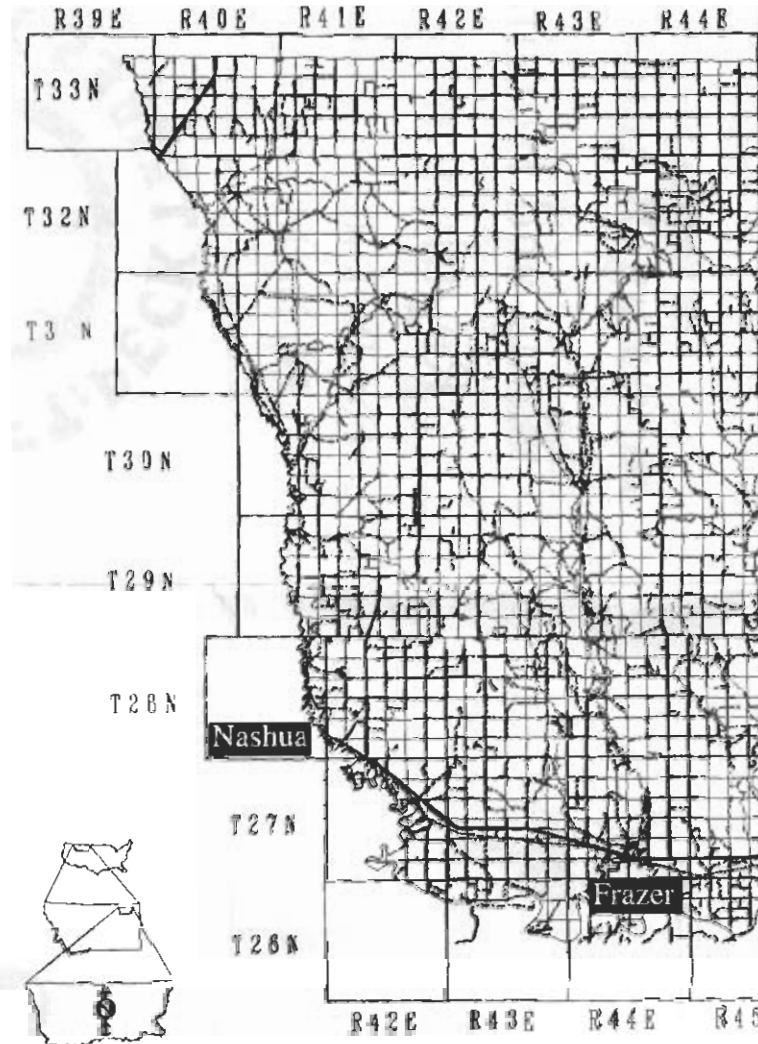

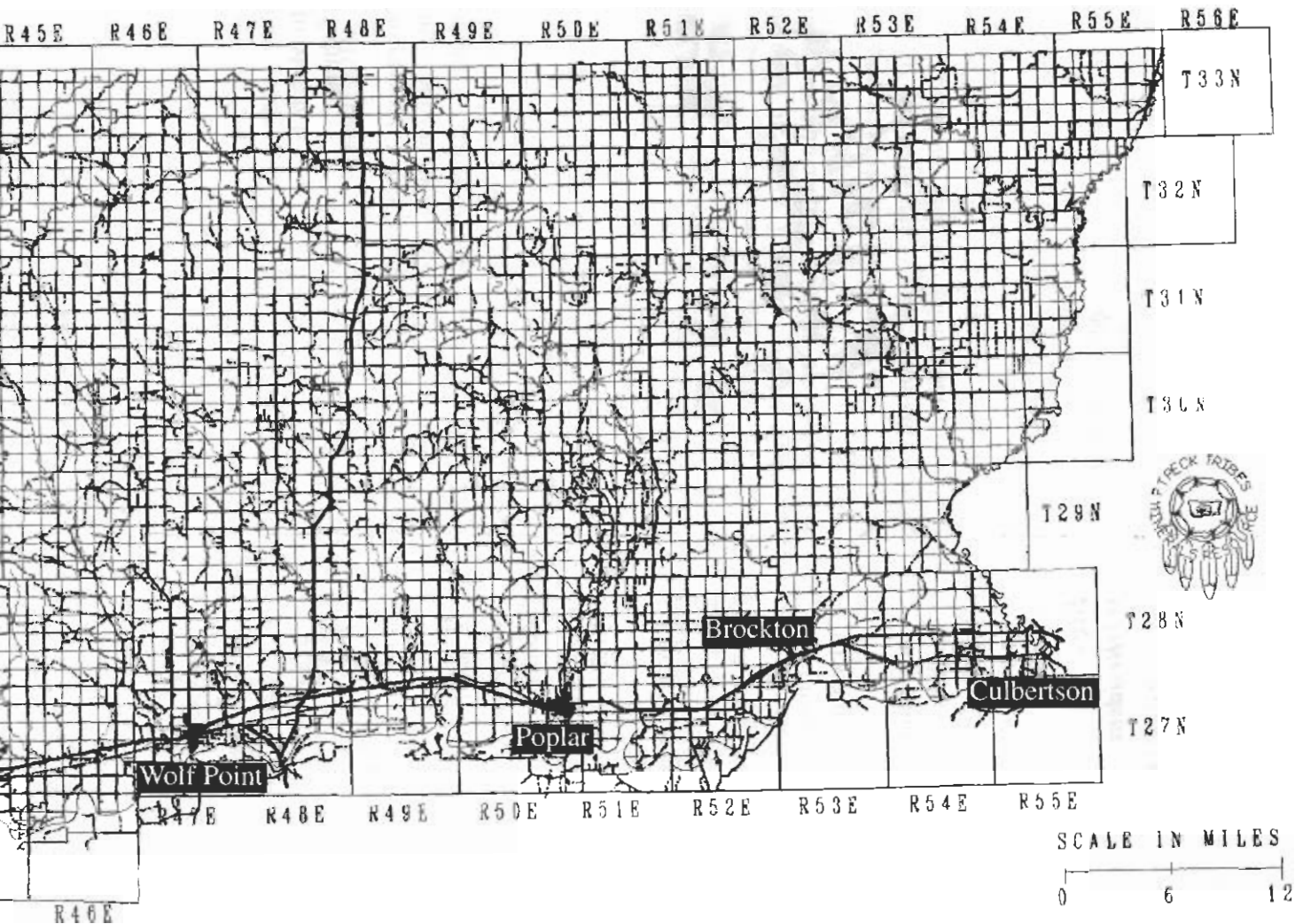


Steel shot must be used on waterfowl.

FEES AND SEASONS ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE

- Sage Grouse Season and bag limits will follow State of Montana.
- Sharptail season and bag limits will follow State of Montana.
- Hungarian Partridge season and bag limits will follow State of Montana.
- Pheasant (Cocks Only) season and bag limits will follow State of Montana.
- Waterfowl season and bag limits will follow State of Montana.
- Small Upland Game Birds may be taken with a shotgun no larger than a 12 gauge. No small caliber rifles are allowed.
- Pheasants (Cocks) may be taken with a shotgun no larger than a 12 gauge. No small caliber rifles are allowed.



Fort Peck Reservation



Any person holding a special permit, birding or fishing permit and stamp as required under Title XIX of the Comprehensive Code of Justice shall carry such permit and stamp when hunting or fishing. Upon request of any member of the Fort Peck Tribes Conservation Department or Tribal Police Officer, He / She shall show the permit and stamp as requested by such Officer.
